Theological Truths That Guide Our Giving

- Eternal perspective We give in light of the fact that our hope is in eternal things, not in earthly things. (1 Timothy 6:6-19; Matthew 6:19-21; Luke 12:13-21)
- Pre-eminence of Christ We give in light of the fact that Jesus is pre-eminent and first in all things. (Colossians 1:15-20; Genesis 4:2-5; Matthew 6:25-34)
- ► <u>Gospel-driven</u> We give in light of the fact that Jesus died on the cross for our sins and our lives are fully surrendered to Him. Plainly put, we give in light of the gospel. (2 Corinthians 9)
- Privilege Generosity is our privilege, and we give out of joy not out of obligation. We don't have to give; we get to give. (2 Corinthians 8-9; Luke 18:9-14)
- Conduit of God's grace We have been enriched in every way to be generous on every occasion, and through our generosity it produces thanksgiving to God. (2 Corinthians 9:11). It is by God's grace that we are even able to do this. (2 Corinthians 9:14)
- Trust in God Our investment in God's economy over the world's economy is a reflection of where our trust truly lies. (Mark 10:17-31)
